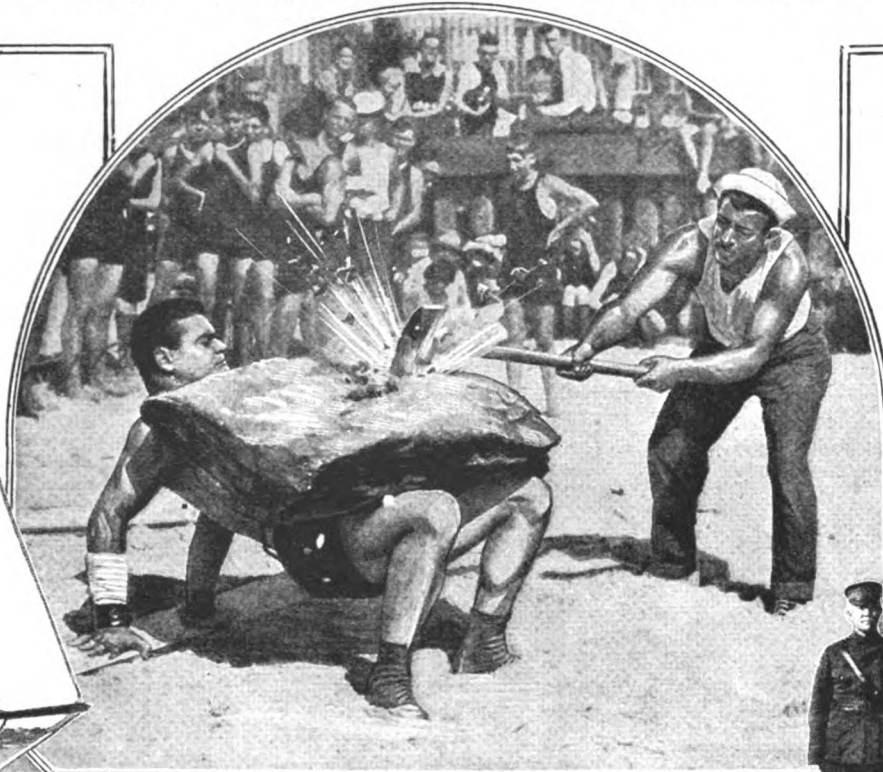
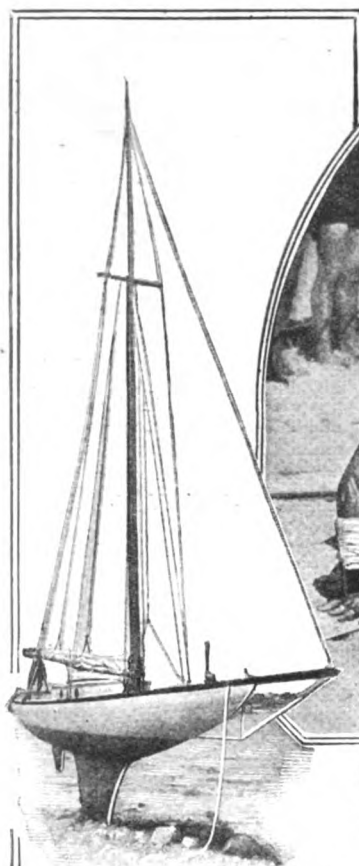


Huge Boulder Broken over Modern Samson's Chest

Washed ashore at New Rochelle, N. Y., the sloop *Kalmia* remained upright when the tide fell, standing with her deep keel embedded in sand and rock



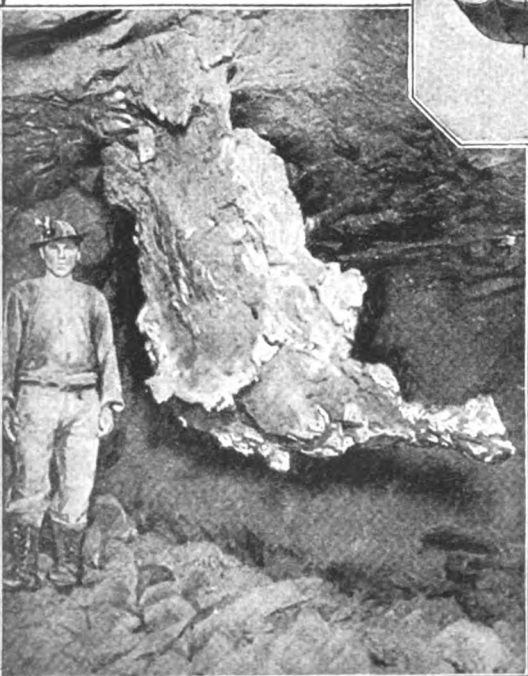
Umbrellas for Bait

A 400-Pound Baby

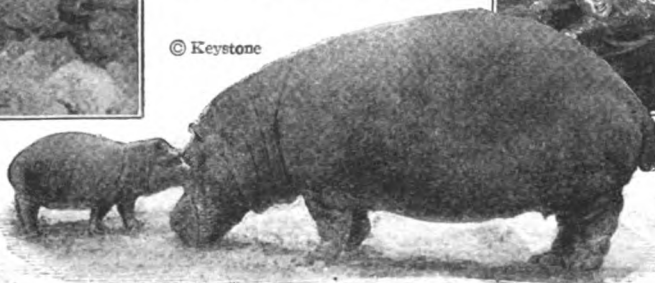
