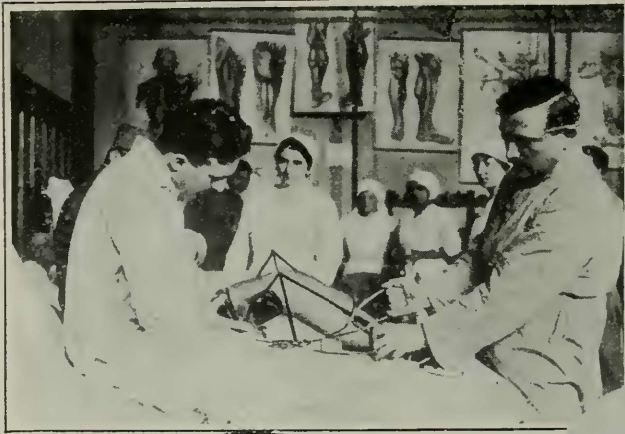
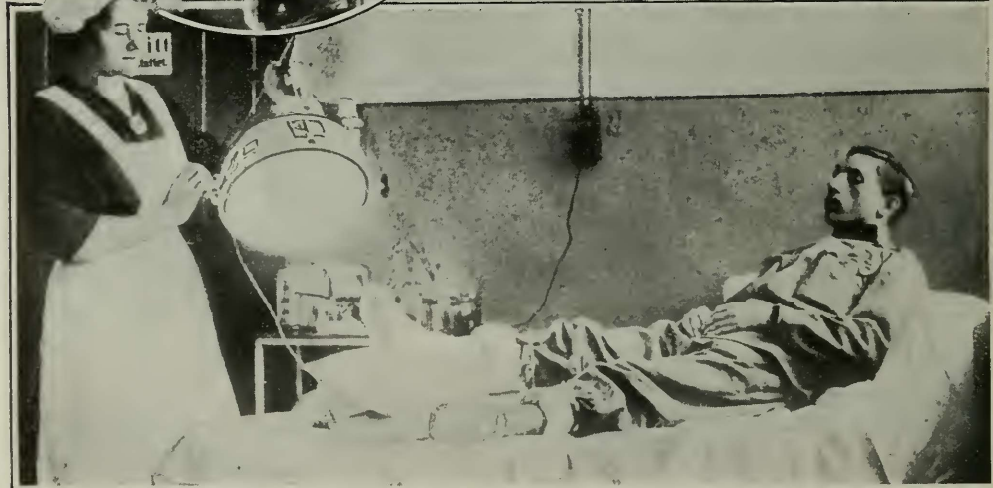
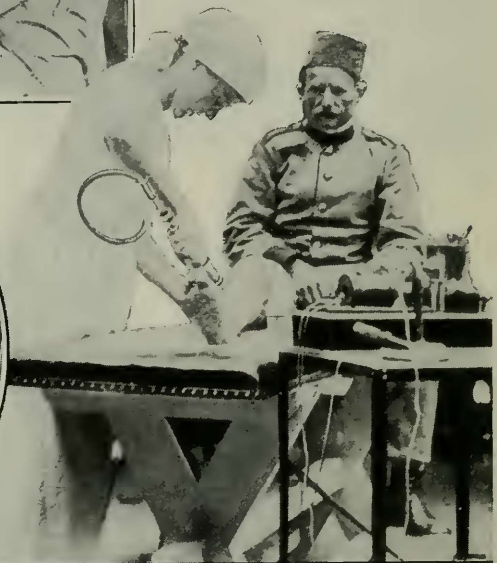
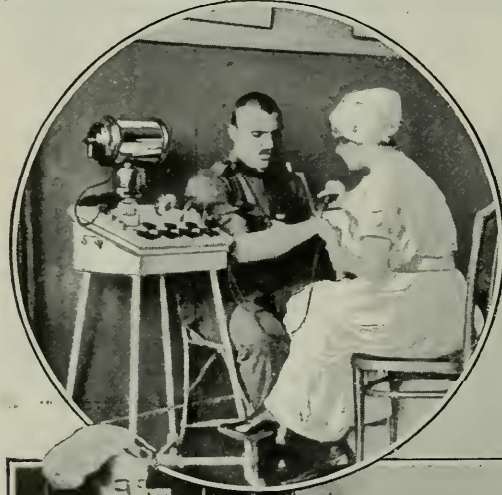


## Electricity in the Hospitals
